N.V Moët & Chandon - Brut Impérial N.V. (Épernay) A harmonious blend of all three varietals and reserve wines. Pale yellow in colour with shades of green. Predominantly Pinot characteristics. Very ample on the palate with a discreet finish.	2100
Veuve Clicquot Yellow Label Brut NV Persistent golden sparkle. Apple, citrus and caramel. Elegant, crispness and spicy finish.	2300
N.V Moët & Chandon – Brut Imperial Rosé (Épernay) Fresh fruity subtle in style, a rosé champagne with aromas of red currants and wild strawberries. The glamorous and extrovert expression of the Moët house style.	2100

N.V L'Ormarins Brut (Franschhoek) The wine is characterised by light, yeasty aromas, a rich and creamy complexity, with the mousse giving it freshness and finesse.	130 510
Domaine de Dieux 'Claudia' (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2016 Apple and creamy lemon curd notes mingled with a hint of perfumed red berries, creamy and mineral palate with long fresh citrus and toasty brioche finish.	760
Domaine de Dieux 'Rose of Sharon' Rosé (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2013 Strawberry, black cherry, raspberry notes with hints of rose water, a soft and rich mousse with a clean, dry finish.	760

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SAUVIGNON BLANC

glass | bottle

The Cape produces superb examples of Sauvignon Blanc. The best wines come from the coolest areas in the specific districts, where canopy management is particularly important. Sauvignon Blanc has a good affinity to age well.

Seasalter Sauvignon Blanc (Darling) 2022

115 | 450

An established, award-winning pedigree. This Seasalter is an intense Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon blend (10%) displaying typical Darling minerality and soft nuances of citrus, stone fruit and green apple. This blend is slightly different from the maiden vintage which is part of a limited range that was launched in 2018.

50% of this wine was aged in French Oak barrels while the other half remained on the lease in tanks.

Anthonij Rupert Wines 'Protea' (Franschhoek) 2022

260

This wine showcases individuality. Pure pungent fruit, but still shows assertive green asparagus, gooseberry, and grassy aromas.

Thelema 'Sutherland' (Elgin) 2022

340

This wine displays a light straw colour with hints of lime green on the rim. The nose has distinct aromas of greengage, guavas, and quince.

Newton Johnson (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2022

340

The Sauvignon Blanc is sophisticated and poised. The grapes were picked on taste to retain the natural acidity.

Southern Right (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2022

115 | 440

This wine is complex, persistent, and rich with a vibrant mineral core. There is appealing sea saltiness to the wine.

Strandveld 'Pofadderbos' (Elim) 2022

410

Passionfruit, grapefruit, and distinctive blackcurrant on the nose. Creamy and full on the palate with citrus and oyster shell minerality and finish with a lovely acidity.

Seven Springs (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2020

330

This wine has a beautiful bouquet of green apple, peach and tropical fruits that leads into a palate that is complex and concentrated with underlying notes of minerality balanced well with an elegant acidity.

Bonnievale – The River Collection (Bonnievale) 2022

70 | 260

Fresh and Crisp with a slight flinty underdone, this Sauvignon Blanc delivers fruit flavour balanced by subtle herbaceous notes.

VIOGNIER

glass | bottle

Some believe that Viognier is related to Gewürztraminer because of its aromatic qualities. Not a widely planted grape yet. It produces a full-bodied wine and is often wood matured. The oval grapes are small but deep in colour.

Creation - Unwooded (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2022

105 | 390

Abundantly fruity and forthcoming yet refined on the nose with fragrant white peach aromas mingling with a rich, creamy character.

RIESLING**glass | bottle**

In South Africa, there is sometimes confusion between the locally named Weisser Rhine Riesling (just called Riesling in Germany) and Cape Riesling, which is a completely different variety better known as Cruchen Blanc in Europe. Of all the classic white varieties, it is perhaps the most notable for its longevity, developing extraordinary complexity in the bottle over many years and maintaining that peak performance for many more.

Thelema 'Sutherland' (Elgin) 2022**370**

Fragrant and inviting on the nose with characteristic aromas of orange blossoms and lime. The palate shows flavours of white peach, hints of citrus and elegant minerality.

CHENIN BLANC**glass | bottle**

The most widely planted variety in the Cape. This very versatile variety produces good natural wines covering the whole spectrum from sweet to dry, sherry as well as sparkling wine. Jan van Riebeeck probably introduced Chenin Blanc to the Cape. Chenin Blanc is currently by far the most planted grape variety.

Cavalli Reserve (Stellenbosch) 2022**125 | 490**

Complex aromatics of pear, white peach, and lean yellow fruit backed apple and raw honey on the nose. The palate has a weightless intensity with great fruit concentration, fresh acidity, and a saline finish.

Mulderbosch 'Steen op Hout' (Stellenbosch) 2022**290**

This Chenin has wonderful ripeness yet, retains its freshness and vibrancy. Ripe aromas of mango, pineapple and papaya are lifted by a crisp refreshing note.

Beaumont - Unwooded (Walker Bay) 2022**95 | 370**

Vibrant fresh colour. Green melon, golden delicious apple and delicate apricot blossom aromas. On the palate there's fresh green apple flavours with a hint of wood spice. Good balanced acidity keeps the weight of the wine fresh with great length.

Joostenberg 'Agter Os' (Paarl) 2022**390**

Wooded, yet fruity on the palate. Tones of lime, honeysuckle, ripe pineapple and apricots. A rich and creamy palate with a complex fruity aftertaste.

CHARDONNAY**glass | bottle**

This noble grape variety made famous in Burgundy is found in most wine-producing countries today. All winemakers aspire to make wine from this fashionable variety.

Thelema 'Sutherland' - Unoaked (Elgin) 2020**480**

Bright and fruity with green apple and citrus flavours with hints of vanilla and a hint of butterscotch flavour.

Springfield Wild Yeast Chardonnay – Unoaked (Robertson) 2021**120 | 460**

Creamy vanilla nose from malolactic fermentation with expressive fruit of pear, gooseberries, citrus, and melon

Newton Johnson 'South End' (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2022**150 | 580**

This Chardonnay is mineral, complex, always refreshing and simply big and buttery. The oak is carefully managed, adding an extra dimension.

Julien Schaal (Elgin) 2021**490**

Flavours are brought beautifully into focus by a tight line of natural acid and dry minerality. An elegant, yet textured and intense wine.

Restless River (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2020**1300**

Length, creaminess, and complexity define this wine. Grapefruit, white peaches, ripe pear and roasted hazelnut aromas and flavours.

Seven Springs (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2019	620
Slightly sweeter, but still a classic Chardonnay still showing all the fresh characteristics of the Overberg.	
Tesselaarsdal (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2022	880
A particularly bright, tight, and pure Chardonnay with marked elegance. Clean primary fruit character and citrus blossom introduce a long, gentle palate, very expressive but also deliciously classical and restrained. This is a graceful and age worthy wine with an almost crystalline purity.	
WHITE BLENDS	glass bottle
<i>Recent years have seen the South African winemakers explore many different combinations of blended white wines. Blends that range from Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc to Viognier and Semillon. The resultant wines are both interesting and challenging. To truly appreciate these wines, one must be prepared to explore and savour the wine. Often you will discover something completely new.</i>	
Jordan 'Chameleon' (Stellenbosch) 2022	270
An intriguing blend - grassy, green, fig Sauvignon Blanc and zesty, citrus-melon Chardonnay, balanced by a long creamy finish.	
Cavalli 'Cremello' (Stellenbosch) 2022	540
A smoky, savoury nose with generous notes of vanilla, honey and ripe fruits. The palate is smooth with an interesting linearity laced with a creaminess from the peaches, guavas and honeysuckle. Aged for 12 months in selected French oak.	
Bouchard Finlayson 'Blanc de Mer' (Walker Bay) 2021	80 300
Refined and elegant with a firm acidity giving direction. Abundance of ripe zesty fruit with a delectable full mouth feel.	
Ashbourne - 'Sandstone' (Walker Bay) 2022	840
A lower alcohol un-wooded wine. Sauvignon Blanc being particularly successful on sandstone soils, they aimed to have this as the lead grape, structurally and aromatically, with another partner Chardonnay contributing to age-worthiness and palate depth and structure without competing with the aromatics.	
ROSE	glass bottle
<i>The delicate pink colour of these wines is achieved by allowing the juice, once pressed, very limited contact with the skins to extract a little of the colour. The result is a light wine with some of the characteristics of a red.</i>	
Hermanuspietersfontein 'Die Bloos' (Overberg) 2022	85 320
A unique Bordeaux style blush wine packed with berries, a refreshing acidity and flowing balance.	
Bonnievale Cinsault – The River Collection (Bonnievale Ward) 2022	70 260
Made in crisp dry style of Rose that has been perfected in Southern France. This wine is light, aromatic and refreshing. Red fruit flavours on the nose and palate.	
Buitenverwachting (Constantia Valley) 2022	280
A salmon pink blend of noble red grape varieties offers fresh strawberry characteristics with subtle undertones of peach flavours.	
CABERNET SAUVIGNON	glass bottle
<i>It is the noblest red grape in the world. Robust and sometimes austere on its own, the addition of Merlot and Cabernet Franc softens it and adds complexity.</i>	
Cavalli (Stellenbosch) 2019	660
Notes of dark chocolate, fruit compote and black forest cake are followed by plum, cedar and vanilla on the palate. The wine is showing a fresh, elegant mid-palate with a robust tannin and velvety finish	
Villiera (Stellenbosch) 2020	420
Firm and spicy with concentrated dried currant, with sage and wild berry notes.	

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Full bodied with earthy hints and hints of blackberry and cedar.	
Raka (Klein Rivier) 2020	540
An Elegant structured wine with berry fruit aromas and soft mint on the palate. This wine has beautiful depth of character.	
Springfield 'Whole Berry' (Robertson) 2019	125 480
This wine is unrefined and unfiltered. A velvety wine with softer tannins and classical varietals characteristics	
Bonnievale - The River Collection (Bonnievale) 2021	70 260
A classic and refined wine with intense, ripe red and blackberry flavours. Soft tannins underpin the beautiful integration between wood and fruit characters.	
MERLOT	glass bottle
<i>Merlot produces beautifully coloured wines, soft in fruit but capable of great richness. It is invaluable in Bordeaux, bringing fruity lushness and a velvet quality to wines that might otherwise be rather hard and austere.</i>	
Villiera (Stellenbosch) 2020	360
Hints of cedar wood and vanilla with attractive dark berry fruit on the palate, the wine is rich and full, with soft tannins.	
Raka Barrel Selected (Klein Rivier) 2020	150 580
A full bodied, classy Merlot that shows a brooding dark berry fruit profile, amply supported by chocolates and vanilla. The textured palate is defined by an enduring line of soft tannins and a long lingering aftertaste.	
Anthonij Rupert Protea Merlot (Franschhoek) 2020	280
Vibrant black cherry and plum aromas with a hint of tomato plant and dark chocolate. Instant appeal with soft, squish, succulent dark fruit with a light tobacco leaf edge. Ample plum and cherry with spice highlights and deeper earth and cocoa notes below. Softly texture but with a supportive structure and fame.	
Creation Merlot (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2020	620
Multi-faceted, like a finely cut ruby in the glass – with a bounty of fruity, spicy aromas to invite you in. On the palate, rewarding dark chocolate and mocha combine with generous ripe berry flavors, supported by the firm structure derived from judicious oak maturation.	
PINOTAGE	glass bottle
<i>Developed by Prof. Abraham Perold in 1925, Pinotage is the result of a cross between Pinot Noir and Cinsault (then known as Hermitage). The wine boasts the truly distinctive sweetness of red berry fruit with a characteristic banana-like aroma and flavour.</i>	
Beaumont (Botrivier) 2020	185 720
A perfect example of elegance and finesse. Red berry, cherries and plum on the nose. Excellent balance and structure on the palate.	
Springfontein -Unfiltered Terrior Selection (Walker Bay) 2019	920
This light Pinotage opens with red fruit with hints of earthy notes. They palate is rich with ripe savoury red fruit and subtle tannins.	
Southern Right (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2021	960
A big bold wine with hints of chocolates and cherries.	
Bonnievale – The River Collection (Bonnievale) 2021	280
Pure plum and red berry flavours are supported by subtle coffee and chocolate aroma In this wine that comes together in a juicy, soft taste sensation.	

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SHIRAZ

glass | bottle

It is claimed that Syrah or Shiraz, as it is called in South Africa and Australia, originated in the Persian town of Shiraz. For the last few hundred years the grapes have been grown in the Northern Rhône valley of France, where the grape makes big, rich, tannic wines, with a good deal of fruit.

First Sighting (Elim) 2020

370

Excellent balance between well integrated oak and fruit. White pepper dominates the nose, the wine explodes into ripe plush fruit on the palate.

Zandvliet Shiraz (Robertson) 2020

110 | 420

Ripe complex nose showing flavours of plum, blackcurrants and pepper with hints of mix spice. These deep flavours follow through seamless, supple and complex palate with added hints of dark chocolate

Raka Biography (Klein Rivier) 2019

520

Black berries and cassis. On the palate, this medley of ripe fruit and subtle tannins compliments each other.

Rivendell (Botrivier) 2015

420

Black cherry with hints of Mocha and spice on the nose. Smoky, cured ham and truffle notes. Full rich and elegant with a long finish.

Seven Springs Syrah (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2019

440

The wine is rich, complex, and round with a smooth and lush tannin well integrates with the oak. An aftertaste of liquorice and spices fills the senses with a lingering mineral character.

Luddite - 750ml (Botrivier) 2019

2200

Big, bold, deep rich red colour with combination of vanilla and chocolate. Smooth and accessible on the palate. Very gentle with a sensation of warmth.

PINOT NOIR

glass | bottle

The oldest of the wine grape varieties originated in Burgundy, where it is recorded to have existed since the fourth century. Under ideal conditions and in the right place, Pinot Noir can produce the richest, the most velvet-smooth wines in the world. The ideal temperature to serve Pinot Noir is 16°.

ATARAXIA PINOT NOIR 2018

1250

The wine has an intriguing luminous hue that reflects rather than absorbs light. A compellingly seductive bouquet offers up a fine blend of aromas of red cherries, pomegranate, delicate forest floor and a hint of spice and new oak.

Hamilton Russell (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2022

1900

This Pinot Noir is not overtly fruity, soft and “sweet” and it generally shows hints of that alluring savoury “primal” character along with dark, spicy, complex primary fruit perfume.

Seven Springs (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2017

115 | 440

The 2014 has a soft and supple palate and is medium bodied, with light and pure fruit characters. Garnet in colour, the wine offers opulent aromas of strawberries and cherries and hints of forest floor.

Tesselaarsdal (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2022

1800

A particularly bright, tight and pure Pinot Noir with marked elegance. Clean and lifted wild red fruit and sour cherry aromas introduce a long, gentle palate with a salty minerality. This is a graceful and age worthy wine with an almost crystalline purity.

RED BLENDS

glass | bottle

The exact definition of a Cape Style red blend has yet to be decided. There seems to be consensus that the wine should contain our own grape Pinotage. Though in what percentage seems to be the debating point. That said the wines below offer some of the finer South African blends. The Bordeaux style wines obviously contain either all or some of the classic Bordeaux grapes.

Creation Cab Merlot Petit Verdot (Hemel-en-Aarde) 2020 620

Opaque and blue-black in colour, with glimmers of violet, it expresses a bouquet rich with blackcurrant and blackberry aromas, with a backdrop of smoky oak.

Boschendal Black Angus (Stellenbosch) 2019 1250

Full bodied with black pepper & cherry flavours on the nose, rich and complex palate with oak spice.

Beyerskloof 'Synergy' (Stellenbosch) 2020 100 | 380

Pinotage/Merlot/Cabernet Sauvignon/Shiraz

The fruit aromas compliment the palette. Juicy middle, great balance lingering aftertastes are all attributes that make this wine a classic Cape Blends.

Ataraxia (Hemel-en-Aarde Ridge) 2020 660

A finely scented vibrant nose with beautifully lifted dark berry fruit and intriguing mineral and spicy notes characterises this wine.

Strandveld 'Navigator' (Elim) 2018 540

Generous length, rounded tannins with a supple consistency, followed by a clean finish and flowing balance.

Iona 'One Man Band' (Elgin) 2018 840

The sumptuous berry bouquet tempts with generous blackberry and black current.

NOBLE LATE HARVEST

glass | bottle

Each year, the producers of Noble late harvest, wait for the appearance of Botrytis Cinerea (Noble Rot) to appear on the grapes. The climatic conditions must be just right. Too cold, too wet, or too hot and the harvest will not succeed. This micro-organism reduces the moisture of the grape and concentrates its sugars, and the fungus adds specific character to the eventual wine. Yield from these vines is low and the costs high. This explains the higher price of these wines. However, the liquid gold in the bottles is well worth it.

Bon Courage (375ml) (Robertson) 2022 80 | 540

Weisser Riesling/Noble Late Harvest

Botrytis infected bunches were handpicked. An elegant dessert wine with hints of honey and fragrances of peach and apricots.

Paul Cluver (375ml) (Elgin) 2021 120 | 820

Weisser Riesling/Noble Late Harvest

Apricots, peaches, and pineapple, mixed with a touch of honey lingering on the nose.

A fine balance between acidity and sweet

THE HEMEL-EN-AARDE VALLEY

The Hemel-en-Aarde Valley is divided in three appellations. The Hemel-en-Aarde Valley, Upper Hemel-en-Aarde and The Ridge.

THE HEMEL-EN-AARDE

The Hemel-en-Aarde Valley near Hermanus offers an unforgettable wine experience in the Overberg.

The wines produced in this region are unique to South Africa and similar to wines from Northern France, due to a cool sea breeze and clay soil. Two of the most popular wines are Chardonnay and exceptional Pinot Noir.

This is the first appellation as you leave Hermanus and enter the Hemel-en-Aarde Valley. It is also home to the first Vineyards planted in the area and is the closest to the Atlantic Ocean of the three appellations.

UPPER HEMEL-EN-AARDE

This is the second appellation as you proceed northeast up the Hemel-en-Aarde Valley from Hermanus and is the largest of the three Hemel-en-Aarde appellations. Ripening tends to occur later here than for the Hemel-en-Aarde Valley appellation. It is the second closest appellation to the sea.

THE HEMEL-EN-AARDE RIDGE

This is the third and smallest appellation encountered as you proceed along the R320 from Hermanus and the furthest from the sea. It is located at the headwaters of the Klein River Valley.

The Elgin Valley, centre of the apple producing industry in South Africa, is now also home to a thriving wine industry. The area is characterised by small family farms, world class wines and top young wine makers.

Elgin Valley Wine Route is the coolest wine growing area along South Africa's south coast. This bountiful valley is developing a reputation for outstanding wines, characterised by their mineral undertones, and complimented by good natural acidity, displaying an elegance that has its origins in our uniquely cool terroir.
